

MARATHA VIDYA PRASARAK SAMAJ, NASHIK

The revolutionary thought of Mahatma Jyotirao Phule - 'There is no other alternative but education for social change' created an awareness about education in the common masses of Maharashtra. The same thought was pursuaded by the great thinker reformers like His Highness Rajashree Shahu Maharaj, His Highness Shreemant Sayajirao Gaikwad Maharaj, Maharshee Vitthal Ramji Shinde, Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar, Dr. Karmveer Bhaurao Patil, Dr. Punjabrao Deshmukh and others. All these personalities were great visionaries who firmly believed that unless we open the channels of education from pre-primary to higher level, the light of knowledge will not reach the doors of common masses in the villages. The followers of this tradition, Karmveer Raosaheb Thorat, Karmveer Ganpatdada More, D.R. Bhosale and others initiated the task of spreading education by establishing 'Udoji Maratha Hostel' in 1914. It was a significant beginning. It was in 1913 that All India Maratha Education Conference was organised in Nashik, wherein His Highness Shreemant Udajirao Pawar of Dhar Residence donated Rs. 10,000/- which strengthened the very foundation of the Institution. In order to stabilise the work of the Institution, His Highness started a grant of Rs. 2,000/- per annum. Rajashree Shahu Maharaj donated Rs. 15000/-. Shreemant Sayajirao Gaikwad Maharaj donated Rs. 12,000/-. His Highness Shreemant Madhavrao Maharaj of Gwalior Residence donated Rs. 10,000/-. The then Industrialist Pandurang Javaji Chaudhari of Bombay donated Rs. 3,000/- and others blessed the Institution in the form of donation so as to enable it to expand its educational work.

'Bahujan Hitaya Bahujan Sukhaya'- 'For the Welfare and Happiness of the Common Masses' is the motto of the Institution. To follow this motto and help the masses, the then social workers like Shankarrao Kadam Kanaladkar, Bhausaheb Hiray, Kakasaheb Wagh, Annasaheb Murkute came forward. The Institution gained name and fame in a short time due to well organisation and disciplined planning. Since various donors and social workers belonging to various places generously helped the Institution, the small plant of the institution began to blossom. The year 1964 was celebrated as its Golden jubilee year. The year 2014 is celebrated as its Centenary. The qualitative and quantitative sky rocketing development of the Institution is simply wonderful. The contribution and devotion of the ex-office bearers and in office bearers as well as the members of the Managing Council have made this possible.

The government of Maharashtra felicitated the Institution by giving a state Award to honour its educational and social work. Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University, Nashik has praised the Institution by giving it the 'Punjabrao Deshmukh Award' in 2006.

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

M.V.P. Samaj's Law College, Nashik has been established in June 2004 under the approval Letter No. NMV 2003 / Law / (12/03) M.S. 3 Higher and Technical Education Dept. dated 6 Nov. 2003 of the Government of Maharashtra.

The college is affiliated to the University of Pune and the Approval of Affliation of the College

has been granted by the Bar Council of India.

The college is situated in a spacious and beautiful building with a rich Library, reading rooms, internet, well ventilated classrooms, Ladies' room and all other essential facilities. The college has experienced and qualified teaching staff. The regular teaching faculty is well supported by the visiting faculty of reputed and learned academicians and advocates practising in various courts in Nashik. The College is housed in the rich and serene environment of MVP Samaj campus. The College is just 3 k.m. from the C.B.S. (Central Bus Station) and about 14 k.m. from Nashik - Road Railway Station. The Law college has been striving to become one of the well-known and reputed institutions imparting legal education. The focus is on practical training through field visits, root courts, trial education programme.

- 2. Three Year Law Course (LL.B.). - MH-CET (Law) is necessary
- 3. D.T.L. (Diploma in Taxation Law) - No CET
- 4. D.L..L & L.W. (Diploma in Labour law & Labour welfare. - No CET
- 5. D.I.P.R.L.- Diploma in intellectual Property Right Law. - No CET

Admission Procedure

As per the Notification of the Govt. of Maharashtra the Admission in to first year Law Degree Course (3 years & 5 years) will be on the basis of MH-CET (Law) from the Academic year 2016-17 and the eligibility cretria is as follows.

1) CET is compulsary for 3 year and 5 year Law degree courses.

- 2) No CET for diploma courses. For diploma courses admission is given on first come first served basis. One can do the diploma along with any degree course.
- 3) The college provides following facilities regarding CET
 - (i) Assistence for filling online form for CET registration
 - (ii) Preparatory classes are conducted for CET
 - (iii) Assistence for filling online forms for CAP rounds



Eligibility for Admission:

- FIVE YEAR LAW COURSE (B.A. LL.B.)
- A student who has passed the Higher Secondary Education (H.S.C.) certificate examination a) with English or an Equivalent examination with aggregate minimum of 45% marks (40% for S.C. & S.T. Student) shall be eligible for admission in to the First Year of Five Year Law degree course (B.A. LL.B.)
- Three Year Diploma Examination of Board of Technical Education, (Subject to approval of b) Bar Council of India)
- D.Ed. with English (Shasakiya Pariksha Mandal, Pune) or c)
- Corporal Test after 10th (SSC) with English & I.A.F. Educational Test for promotion to the rank d) of Corporal.

THREE YEAR LAW COURSE (LL.B.) II.

First Year LL.B. a)

A student who has passed Bachelor's degree examination with minimum of 45% marks (40% Student) in any faculty of University of Pune or any other Recognized marks for S.C. & S.T. University shall be eligible for admission in to the First Year of Three Year Law degree course (LL.B.).

The Candidates who have obtained 10+2 or Graduation/post Graduation through open Universities System directly without having any basic Qualifications for Prosecuting such Studies are not Eligible for admission in law courses as per Bar Council of India circular.

b)

A student who has taken admission to II LL.B. course of this University, after passing the First LL.B. examination from any other University recognised by AIU and Bar Council of India will have to appear and pass in the subject of First LL.B. course of this University in which he has not already passed in his parent University. Further, if he so desires, he will be exempted in any of the subjects of the Second LL.B. examination of this University in which he has already passed in the parent University. However, in such case, he will not be awarded class at the II LL.B. examination.

c)

A student passing the Second Year LL.B. (LL.B. General) examination from a Statutory Indian by AIU and Bar Council of India is allowed to seek admission to the Third LL.B. Course in his University on the condition that he shall appear for and pass in all the papers prescribed for the First and Second Year LL.B. Course of this University of which he has not passed in his parent University. Further if he so desires, he will be exempted in any of the subjects at the Third LL.B. examination of this University if he has already passed in those subjects in the parent University. However, in such a case, he will be required to appear and pass in the deficient papers according to the syllabus of the First LL.B. / Second LL.B. of this University. Further in such a case he will not be awarded a class at the Third LL.B. examination.

ONE YEAR DIPLOMA COURSES: Eligibility

A student who has passed Bachelor`s degree examination in any faculty of the University of Pune or any other Recognised University shall be eligible for admission to these one year

A copy of information Brochure (Prospectus) of the college along with an application form for admission is available in the college office on payment of the prescribed price during the office hours on all working days. (7)

ADMISSION PROCEDURE AND RULES

The admission in to first year B.A. LL.B. (5 yrs.) and LL.B. (3 yrs.) will be made on the bases of the marks secured in the online MH-CET (Law) conducted by the Govt. of Maharashtra according to Allahamashtra according to Allahamash ing to Allotment of condidates made by the Govt of Maharashtra. The requirement of CET is compulsory for the Admission through Institutional Quota also.

As per the notification of Government of Maharashtra for the admission of 1st year Law 1.

Courses online CET for Law is mandatory from the academic year 2016-2017.

An applicant seeking admission to this college will have to submit a duly filled prescribed 2. printed application for admission along with the required fees and documents before the last date stipulated for admission which is notified by the CET Cell & College.

The applicant who has obtained their degree from the University of Pune should submit the 3. following original documents along with the Application for Admission:

- Passing Certificate of the Qualifying/Previous Examination
- Statement(s) of marks of the Qualifying Examination
- iii) School / College Leaving Certificate or College Transference Certificate
- iv) Caste Certificate in case of a Backward caste applicant
- v) Affidavit by the student regarding UGC Regulation on curbing ragging
- vi) Affidavit by the Parent/Guardian regarding UGC Regulation on curbing ragging
- vii) Two attested photo copies of all the documents mentioned above
- viii) Gap certificate, if there is any gap after passing the qualifying examination
- ix) Application to secure Eligibility certificate from the University of Pune
- x) Undertaking signed by the student and his / her parent / guardian regarding fees rules & disciplin.
- xi) Two passport size very recent photographs of the applicant
- xii) MH-CET Score Card
- xiii) MH-CET Hall Ticket
- xiv) Letter of allotment & any other documents as may be required from time to time.

Applicant from Other University or Board will have to submit, in addition to the above mentioned documents, the following documents also: :

- xii) Migration Certificate
- xiii) Character Certificate
- The applicant will be admitted provisionally and their admission will be confirmed 4. only on receipt of the Eligibility Certificate from the University & document verification & confirmation by CET CELL. Such provisional admission is at the risk of the applicant.
- Acceptance of application for admission with the necessary remittance of fees with-5. out any of the above mentioned documents does NOT amount to admission. It is only a provisional acceptance of the application for admission. Such applicants shall not be a bonafide students of the college, even though their name appears on the roll of students. The Principal reserves the right to remove the name of such student from the roll of students at any time.
- All admissions are on the basis of merit and shall be finalised after completion of the admis-6. sion procedure as per Rules of CET CELL.
- After seeking admission, the student should procure their Identity Card duly signed by the 7. college authority. The Identity Card must be shown by the student whenever demanded by the College and University authorities. The college reserves the right to cancel the admission of any subject on grands of indiscipline, absentee or non payment of complete fees.

FREESHIPS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

The backward caste students can avail S.C., S.T., O.B.C., N.T. and S.B.C. scholarships and freeships on making application in prescribed from with relevant documents to the concerned Government departments. The students belonging to minority communities - Muslim, Parasi, Sikh, Christian, Budha, and Jain can avail the Union Government's scholarship for them. For E.B.C. students Rajarshri C.Shahu Maharaj Shikshan Shulka Scholarship is available. The details can be provided by the college office. It is the respensibility of the student to fulfill all online & offline formalities regarding scholarship.

CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION AND REFUND OF FEES

Normally fees once paid are not refundable. However, the Principal may consider **refunding the fees**, only on the satisfaction about the reason for the cancellation of admission. The refund of fees will be as below:

LIBRARY

The College Library has all the essential Prescribed, Reference and Recommended Text Books, Law Books, Law Journals and Law Reports. It also subscribed Newspapers and Magazines. The Internet facility is available to academic purposes exclusively and AIR Database is accessible to the student in the Library. Also provide remote access from Knimbus Database.

IMPORTANT LIBRARY RULES:

- 1. Students entering the Library must produce the College Identity Card as and when demanded.
- 2. Text Books for home-lending only will be issued to the students.
- 3. Reference Books are not for home lending for available only in the Reading Room for reference only. They cannot be borrowed and taken out of the Library.
- 4. Students must strictly follow the days and timing fixed for borrowing and return of Library books.
- 5. Computer and Internet facility in the Library should be strickly used for academic purpose only.
- 6. Students should not disturb the order of Books, Periodicals or Law Journals and Law Reports arranged in the respective shelves and rows.
- 7. Students must compulsory sign the register maintained in the Library before entry the Library.
- 8. Books are issued on demand and subject to their availability in the Library.
- 9. The Principal, at his discretion may grant access to an outsider on payment of necessary deposits and fees.
- 10. The Library is kept open from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and the timing is extended upto 6:00 p.m. during the examination period, if necessary the timing of Library are changeable.

Please, feel free to see the Librarian in case of any difficulty. The libary has well equipped internet facility. The students and faculties are given online judge. ment download facility for which college has subscribed for manupatra, SCC online.

Limted accommdation is a available in the ladies' Hostels and Boys' Hostels of the sister institutes in Nashik.

RULES OF DISCIPLINE

Boys- White shirt & Black Pant. 1. Dress Code is compulsory.

Every student must regularly attend classes, seminars, workshops, practicals and all other 2. Students shall follow all the norms of discipline and abide by the rules of the discipline of the

college. If not appropriate action will be taken against the erring students. 3.

The regulations jointly made by the University of Pune, the Bar Council of India, Educational Council, the Government of Maharashtra and the College Management will have to be strictly 4.

The students must carry their Identity Cards with them and produce them whenever called $\ensuremath{\mathsf{up}}$ on to do so by the respective authorities in the college and outside the college. 5.

In case of loss of an Identity Card a duplicate Identity Card will be issued on submission of an undertaking by the student regarding the loss and on payment of fee of Rs. 50/- only. 6.

- Students must behave decently and politely with the Principal, the teaching and non-teaching 7. staff members and other students of the college within the college premises or outside the
- Students must be punctual in attendance and must be in their seats five minutes before a 8. lecture begins.

Students must not abstain from classes and practicals on any excuse. 9.

- 10. Students must not loiter in the passages, corridors or on the campus when their curricular and co-curricular activities are going on during college hours disturbing the lectures.
- Students must keep their terms strictly in accordance with the rules of the University of Pune
- 12. Shouting, banging on the staircases, speaking in the library reading room and causing such other nuisane is strictly prohibited.
- 13. Absolute silence must be kept in the reading rooms/Library.
- 14. Smoking, Chewing Gutkha, Pan, Tobacco etc. and Spitting on the college premises, and eveteasing are ragging are strictly prohibited.
- 15. Any weapons that may cause physical injury are strictly prohibited on the premises.
- 16. Grievances, if any, shall be brought to the notice of the Grievance Redressal Committee in the college.
- 17. If a student wants to lodge any complaint or make a written representation of any sort to the University, or State/Union Government, or any other outside agencies, like media, it shall be forwarded through the Principal.
- 18. Students must not provide false information to the college authorities.
- 19. Students must not indulge in malpractice in seeking admission, taking examination and practical training. Use of unfair means in an examination is a punishable offence.
- Misbehaviour by students includes tampering and altering in official documents, obstructing directly or indirectly the working of the college, or any other behaviour that will bring bad name to the college and the MVP Samaj.
- Writing anything on the walls of the classrooms, toilets, doors, windows and boards is strictly prohibited. (10)

- 22. Throwing scraps anywhere on the campus is prohibited. Scraps must be thrown only in the dustbins.
- 23. The furniture, electric lamps, tubes, fans etc. should be used very carefully. No damage in any from should be caused to the college property.
- 24. Any student who is found causing damage to the property of the college or it's sister institutes shall be required to compensate the entire value of the damaged property and shall be subject to such disciplinary action as the college authorities may think proper.
- 25. Outsiders are not allowed on the college campus unless they are given special permission.
- 26. No student shall bring any outsider without the permission of the Principal. Any outsider who is not a student of the sister institute shall be treated as a treapasser and dealt with accordingly.
- 27. Students shall not invite any person to address or entertain them or conduct any function or metting without the prior written permission of the Principal.
- 28. Mobile phones must be kept on silent modes on college premises.
- 29. No student shall participate in any anti-social or anti-college campaign. Nor shall he take part in any religious movement on the premises.
- 30. The examination forms of the irregular students whose class attendance is less than 70% shall be detained by the Principal.
- 31. Any of the following measures shall be taken by the authorities in case of non-observance of the rules and regulations made by the authorities:
 - i) Cancellation of admission.
- ii) Cancellation of terms.
- iii)
 - Detention of examination form. iv) Debarring from the examination.
- V) Suspension from the college.
- vi) Imposing of Fine.
- Confiscation of deposits
- viii) Handing over the guilty students to the appropriate authority.
- 32. All the student should attend the pre-final examinition complsorily, if not liable for penalty.
- 33. All communication's should be forwarded through the principal.
- 34. The admission of the student who is found not residing in the jurisdiction of the college and the University stands cancelled automatically.
- 35. The admission of the student who is found not attending the classes, seminars, workshops, practicals etc. stands cancelled automatically.
- 36. Every student admitted in the college should be in contact with the college/ professors and should note the important dates for payment of exam fees, submission of scholarship form, time table of university examination, internal examinations, results, clinical activities, practicals/projects, visits etc.

37 Ragging:

- i) Ragging, harassment of students, any kind indecent offending behaviour in the college is strictly prohibited.
- ii) Ragging, harassment would show be dealt with as per the special laws/notifications.
- iii) Student's (his/her) admission in the college stands cancelled if he/she is found involved in ragging.
- iv) A student involved in the act of ragging will be rusticated from the college and punished according to the law.
- v) A student should immediately report to the principal or the faculty personally or telephonically any incident of ragging. (See the composition of Anti Ragging Committee on page no. 22)
